The group's gathering place should come as no surprise, given the Chamber's record of opposition to any meaningful attempt at climate action. The Chamber testified in opposition to the Paris Agreement, despite many of its board members' pledges to support the Agreement's goals; it was a leading voice in the lobbying effort against the Waxman-Markey cap and trade legislation; and it sued the Environmental Protection Agency, seeking to overturn the "endangerment finding" that underpins the Clean Air Act. 4
