Shelters

Temporary Shelter

Shelters are available for everyone with needs related to the disaster, including but not limited to those who need a place to stay. Shelters can also provide meals, water, health and mental health services, and information on resources. Assistance is free and only requires sharing your name and where you were living before the disaster. FEMA Disaster Survivor Assistance staff at shelters can help with registration for disaster assistance. All shelters are accessible to people with disabilities. Media are not permitted at emergency shelters.

Shelter locations are subject to change daily. Please bring bedding, clothing, medications, toiletries, and other necessities with you to the shelter. Please do not bring alcohol, illegal drugs, or weapons. Pets can be accommodated, but pets that are not service animals will have to be properly restrained.

Shelter Transportation

For Wailuku and Kahului

Roberts Hawaii is offering an on-demand, free shuttle for people staying at the War Memorial Complex in Wailuku, and the Kings Cathedral and Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints in Kahului.
